967 people fed




8,703 meals



8,462 kg given out



#### Who sends us referrals?



Referrals from East Lothian Council, NHS services and the local CAB offices account for over 70% of referrals. Referrals from the Scottish Welfare Fund have reduced as additional funding was made available via East Lothian Council to reduce reliance on emergency food providers. Musselburgh CAB continues to be our busiest individual referrer (over 20%).

#### Year on year the demand for emergency support has increased



#### Referrals due to low income are at their highest ever



Low income remains the primary reason for referrals accounting for over 70% of all referrals received.
