1161 people fed 407 children


Although the total number of households receiving support in February decreased compared to January, the no. of people supported was similar and there was a small increase in no. of children

WHY WAS HELP NEEDED?

Low income continues to be the most common reason for support being needed.
72% of households needing support in February gave low income as the reason



*Other reasons for support being needed including homelessness, domestic abuse, delayed wages and refused short term benefits advance
